The study using Caveolin-1 for differentiation of Endometrial Carcinoma, Endometrial Intraepithelial Neoplasia, Endometrial Hyperplasia, and Normal Endometrium is promising. You will read that the results of another clinical study from Turkey on increasing implantation rates in IVF cycles are consistent with the international literature. You will find the results of another study that focused on pregnancy with fibroids and cervical length status. The results of this study reveals that cervical length is inversely affected by fibroids during pregnancy while the risk of preterm birth is higher in pregnancy with fibroids. In another study, it will be emphasized to investigate the effects of maternal body mass index (BMI) and total weight gain during the pregnancy (WGDP) on all stages of labor.
